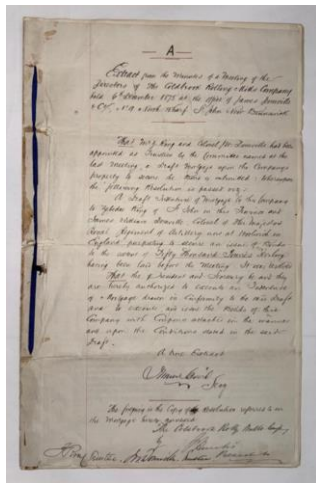

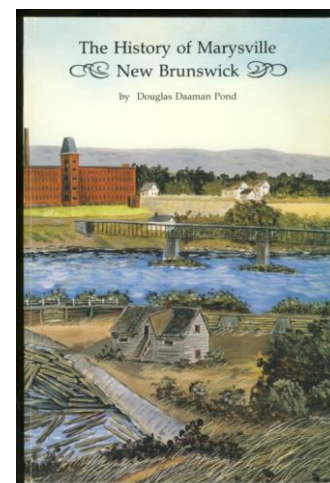
purporting to secure an issue of Bonds to the extent of Fifty Thousand Pounds Sterling having been laid before the Meeting: A true Extract. The Forgoing is the Copy of the Resolution referred to in the Mortgage hereto annexed." Signed at the bottom by Francis Hincks, Zebedee Ring and J.W. Domville. The first page is in manuscript the next 5 pages are printed -'Theis Indenture of Mortgage, made at the city of St. John, in the Province of New Brunswick "first" day of "January" in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and "seventy six" between The Colbrook Rolling Mills Company....represented acting by the Honourable Sir Francis Hincks, K.C.M.G. & C.B. of Montreal, in Canada, the President thereof and James Scovil, the Secretary thereof.....Zebedee Ring of St. John in this

Province and James William Domville, Colonel of Her Majesty's Royal Regiment of Artillery now at Woolwich in England,....in the following form, namely: Dominion of Canada, Province of New Brunswick.

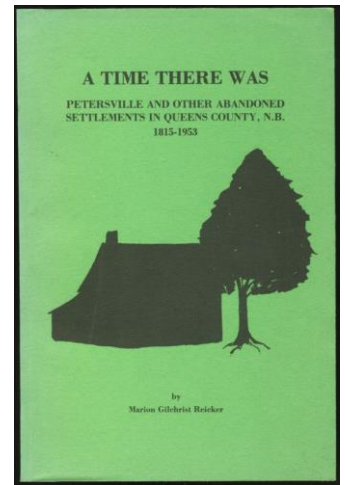
The Coldbrook Rolling Mills Company of the Dominion of Canada. Issue of 50,000 (Pounds)-First Mortgage Bonds. The printed pages 1 to 5 contain articles 1 to 15 with pen corrections. The next page (7) is in manuscript with articles 17 to 19 then the final 2 pages (8 & 9) are also in manuscript colour paper seals and signed by Zebedee Ring, James William Domville, James Scovil and John C. Griffin, Justice of the Peace & O'Hara Baynes, Notary Public [Montreal] and dated January 1st, 1876 St. John, N.B. and 31st. March 1876 in Montreal.

James Domville (November 29, 1842 – July 30, 1921) was a Canadian businessman, militia officer and politician. He was the son of a British major-general, also named James Domville. In 1858 James, Jr. went to Barbados, where his father commanded a regiment. He was educated at the Royal Military Academy and rose to the rank of lieutenant-colonel in the New Brunswick militia, commanding the 8th Princess Louise New Brunswick Hussars Cavalry Regiment. Sir Francis Hincks, KCMG, CB, PC was a Canadian businessman, politician, and British colonial administrator. An immigrant from Ireland, he was the Co-Premier of the Province of Canada, Governor of Barbados, Governor of British Guiana and Canadian Minister of Finance.

This is the first issue of what was to become Canada's premier arts magazine "Canadian Art". These early issues had original art by various artists of the day. The first 6 issue were done with mimeographed text, black and white illustrations on glossy paper and the original on heavy bound paper. All the 15 issues of Maritime Art are very hard to find. Donald Cameron MacKay F.R.S.C. (1906-1979) was a Maritime artist; an Official War Artist for the Royal Navy of Canada; an author and illustrator.

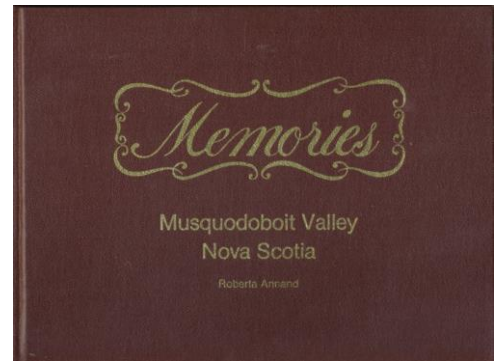

Patricia Lockhart Fleming notes in her bibliography on Atlantic Canadian Imprints 1801-1820 (see Fleming NS169) that John Howe & Son published two states of the title page under two different printers and possibly a third state with their own imprint; "In the Royal Gazette the Howes advertised almanacs for sale at their own office and at the Halifax Journal (1,15 November 1820)".

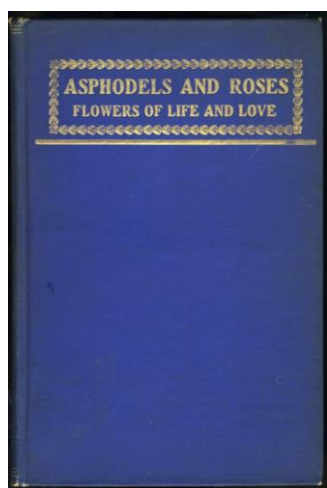
One of the players in the photographs is Roy Isnor a highly-praised left-handed baseball pitcher. He played for the Halifax Crescents baseball team in 1909 and with his terrific speed and great control of the ball, was good enough to turn pro in 1911 with the Nova Scotia Professional League. When the league disbanded in 1914, Roy returned to playing semi-professional baseball with the Halifax Crescents until the early 1920's. His abilities made him a consistent pitcher against the strong imports and professional players of rival clubs. Roy Isnor is an Original Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame Inductee. (N.S. Sports Hall of Fame).

George A. Gauvin (1863-?), born at Burlington, Vermont on 8 August 1863, the son of Leon Gauvin and Rose Gilbert, he was educated at Green Mountain Academy at Underhill, Vermont, then he taught school for two years, after which he opened a photography studio at Burlington with his brother. Sometime later, he moved to Boston, Massachusetts for further education in photography, then he moved to Halifax, Nova Scotia, where he became a photographer with the studio of Kellie & Company. Within a year, he had purchased the business, and took on Adolphe E. Gentzel as a partner, to form the studio of Gauvin, Gentzel & Company. He married Maggie C. Gough of Halifax on 4 October 1892. In 1905, Gentzel moved to Winnipeg to open a studio of Gauvin, Gentzel & Company there, sometimes called the "Elite Photographic Studio" at 492 Main Street. Gauvin remained in Halifax. They employed A. B. Spence as a photographer with the studio. The studio was still operating at the same location by 1912.

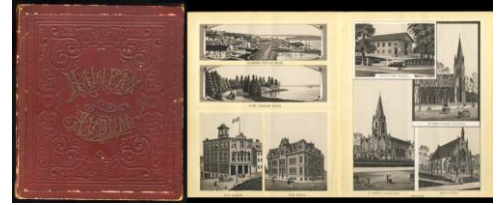

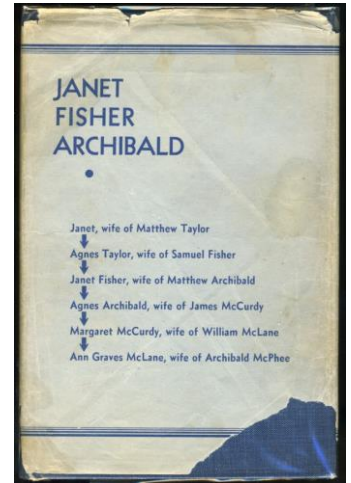

On the morning of 6 December 1917, the French cargo ship SS Mont-Blanc collided with the Norwegian vessel SS Imo in the harbour of Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada. Mont-Blanc, laden with high explosives, caught fire and detonated, devastating the Richmond district of Halifax. At least 1,782 people, largely in Halifax and Dartmouth, were killed by the blast, debris, fires, or collapsed buildings, and an estimated 9,000 others were injured. The blast was the largest human-made explosion at the time. It released the equivalent energy of roughly 2.9 kilotons of TNT (12 TJ).

W.G. MacLaughlan (d. 1935) was raised in Charlottetown and moved to Pugwash in 1895 where he opened a photographic studio (he previously opened a studio in Boston, where he studied). He established the MacLaughlan Studio at Barrington Street in 1914. He was the official military photographer for Halifax. (PANS)

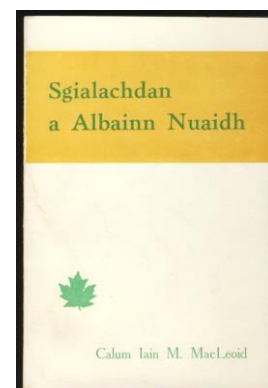

John H. 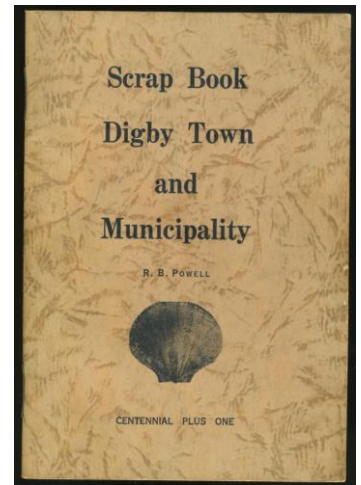

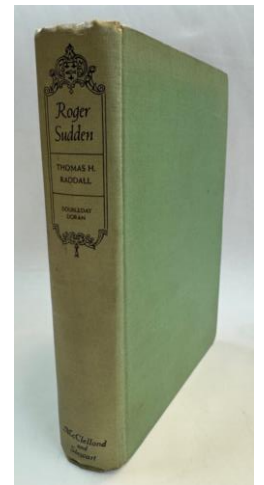
Trollope was a major-general on staff in North American, and commanded a brigade in Canada from Sept. 1856 to Feb. 1858, also the forces in the Lower Provinces from the last date to Oct. 1861, having his head-quarters at Halifax, Nova Scotia, during which time the Prince of Wales visited the Colony, at the time under the government of the Earl of Musgrave, afterwards Marquis of Normanby. On leaving Halifax, Oct. 16th, 1861 there was a corps paraded 'en masse' to witness his departure and part of his honor guard was formed by "a company of negro volunteers which he had especially fostered."
